

1. In PowerPoint, click on the “Multiple Mouse” tab.
2. You have 3 choices for interactive slides: Yes/No, Multiple Choice, or Drawing. If you choose New Slide, you will not be able to create an interactive slide.



Yes/No slide:

1. To create a Yes/No slide, first click the icon in the toolbar.
2. On the slide, click in the text box and type your question.
3. Click on “Assign Answer”, then click on the appropriate answer in the drop-down list.

If you clicked on 1 or 2, a green checkmark will appear on the correct answer in your slide.



(The answer will only appear after the students have completed the slide).

Multiple Choice slide:

1. To create a Multiple Choice slide, first click the icon in the toolbar. Then click on the number of possible answers.



2. On the slide, click in the text box and type your question.
3. Click on each answer’s text box to type the possible answer, or click on the icons in each text box to add a picture, graph, or media clip.

Drawing slide:

1. To create a Drawing slide, first click the icon in the toolbar.
2. On the slide, click the text box and type your instructions for what you’d like students to draw.

Add as many slides as you need, and save your presentation when finished.


To Use Slideshow with your students:

1. Connect multiple mice to a laptop. (You can also connect a USB hub to the laptop, then connect multiple mice to the hub).
2. Start your interactive slideshow. Before your slideshow begins, you will see the below message:



Click Yes if you want to use multiple mice.

3. On the first screen you will need to determine pointing device will be the teacher mouse (this may be the touchpad on a laptop).
4. You will need to identify which mouse is yours, at which point, your mouse pointer becomes the orange arrow.



*If you only have one mouse and want to test your presentation before class, use the keyboard to perform the teacher's role. Press F7 when you see this page in **Play Slide Show** mode.

5. Determine if the students participate in teams or as individuals.
 - a. Students play individually
 - Each student has a different mouse pointer with a different picture.
 - On each slide, all students respond to the same questions with their own answers.
 - b. Students play in teams
 - Each student on a team has a mouse pointer with the same picture.
 - Everyone on the team must select the same answer to each question.

6. If you select **Team mode**, students click a picture to join a team. The pictures on this page represent teams.
- When students click a picture, their mouse pointers change into a team picture.
 - The number at the top of each picture shows how many students have joined that team.



7. If you select **Individual mode**, each student clicks inside of the box to participate in the activity.
- On each multiple-mouse slide, each student uses their own mouse to respond to each question with their own answer.
